Somewhere I have heard the phrase, "Find a need, meet a need." In our modern environment there are programs and people willing to feed the hungry. We work hard meeting the needs of those who are food insecure. We live in a country governed by rules and not by the whim of a dictator. As a result we have physical safety. I have heard it said that there are over 94 million people out of work, yet they seem to eat and have a roof over their heads. What needs do people have? There is a need for belonging and a sense of importance on Maslow's hierarchy of needs. What need can we as Emmaus pilgrims meet? How about providing love and belonging to those who are out of work? Love and

belonging can be provided by a reunion group. Since reunion groups are open they are the logical place where people can meet Christ through your encouragement and testimony. John Wesley used small groups to bring people to Christ. Face-to-face time is more powerful than seeing people in masse. Love and belonging happen much easier in circles compared to rows.

The cost for loving a person into the Kingdom of God is expensive because we must give one of our most precious items, our time. The place for meeting is usually easier to find than the time. Sacrificial love empowers others to open their hearts to God's presence. Face to face interaction replaces superficial relationships. The reunion group becomes the place for real relationships and sense of belonging. We can meet a need by bringing people into a relationship. First, a relationship with us in a loving group, and then with the ultimate relationship with Jesus Christ.

Membership on the Emmaus board is a commitment. I thank each person above who has served, those who are presently serving, and those who will be new to the board in 2017.



and grace? Do you know someone who could benefit from a closer relationship with Jesus (pretty sure that's most of us.) What's stopping you from inviting them? If they say no, ask them again in a few months (or days or weeks.) Pray to have God show you who you should be sponsoring. It might not be who you have in mind. Ask God to send His Holy Spirit to intervene and show you His desires.

Again, pray. Pray for the nation, your community, your workplace, your pastor. Pray for the President (current and future) - even if they aren't your choice of president. Pray for the ministry of the WTE. Pray for the lay directors and teams of the upcoming weekends. Remember 1 Thessalonians 5:17. It's a lot more productive than posting something on Facebook.

Unfortunately, the August men's weekend was cancelled due to too few candidates. Two walks are planned this coming winter. Walk #262 will be held February 23-26, 2017, with Randy Cox serving as the Lay Director. Walk #263 will be March 9-12, 2017, and Carolyn Young will be the Lay Director. Please pray about sponsoring someone for the upcoming walks. We need to assure we have enough pilgrims before the prep weekend, so no more walks are cancelled. We also would invite your prayers for both walks. The Emmaus movement needs your continued support.

We also need your involvement with the board. Please pray about serving on the board. We need you!

Our annual year-end fundraising letter and ballot for the Class of 2019 are included this year in this newsletter - no additional mailing will be sent.

**Election**: We need at least five at-large members for the Board of Directors Class of 2019, and four people have agreed to serve: David Woodside (2nd term), Kathy Hull (2nd term), Alex Leonard, and Gail Farris. At least one more member is needed. Please feel free to submit a write-in candidate using the form on the next page. Board members should have team experience and ideally be a past Lay Director or Assistant Lay Director. The 2019 class will begin serving in January, 2017, and conclude their service in December, 2019. Those who wish to do so may run again for another three-year term. If you have a write-in candidate to nominate, please talk with them first about their willingness to be on the board.


