Residing in the Old Testament: Jesus

While listening to the radio I heard of a book, The Emmaus Code: Finding Jesus in the Old Testament, which made the NY Times' best seller list. It caught my attention because it is an attempt to craft what Jesus was saying to the two downcast disciples as they were walking home to Emmaus following Christ's death and resurrection.

The Emmaus story is presented each weekend to set the context of traveling down the road of life and meeting Jesus. Instead of reading the story I would tell the story or craft the story as a drama, in an attempt to present the story in a fresh way. The book attempts to summarize the scriptures (the OT) to point out things concerning Jesus coming. For instance, the sacrificial system points to Jesus being the final sacrifice, proof of God's ability to forgive sins. The act of sacrifice does not cause forgiveness, but

our belief in God's power to forgive enables God to bring healing of relationships. The blood of the lamb painted on the door posts and lintels of the Israelites' homes prior to the Passover is an act of faith in Jesus' saving power - the blood of Jesus is the final sacrifice.

There are indicators of the Trinity from the beginning: "Let us make man in our own image." The book of Judges shows a pattern of people choosing their own way, then getting into trouble and needing a savior. A person steps up and provides salvation - a hint of Jesus' power and presence.

The story of Ruth is one of salvation as Boaz chooses Ruth as his wife, just as Jesus later picks His followers as His bride. We are also chosen to be His bride.

Scripture continues to call us into a relationship with Jesus. As we drift away in life, Jesus continually calls us to be holy and to live a holy life. His presence is with us.

I know this is not anything new. During my scripture reading this morning, Stephen's message in Acts 8, Stephen tells of Jesus in the scriptures and reminds the professional clerics of their own rebellion.

Jesus was acting as the host to the two disciples, serving the bread of life as they walked along. They realized it when Jesus took the bread and broke it, serving physical bread. The scriptures, as Jesus knew them, hints of our need for a savior, and His presence with us.
